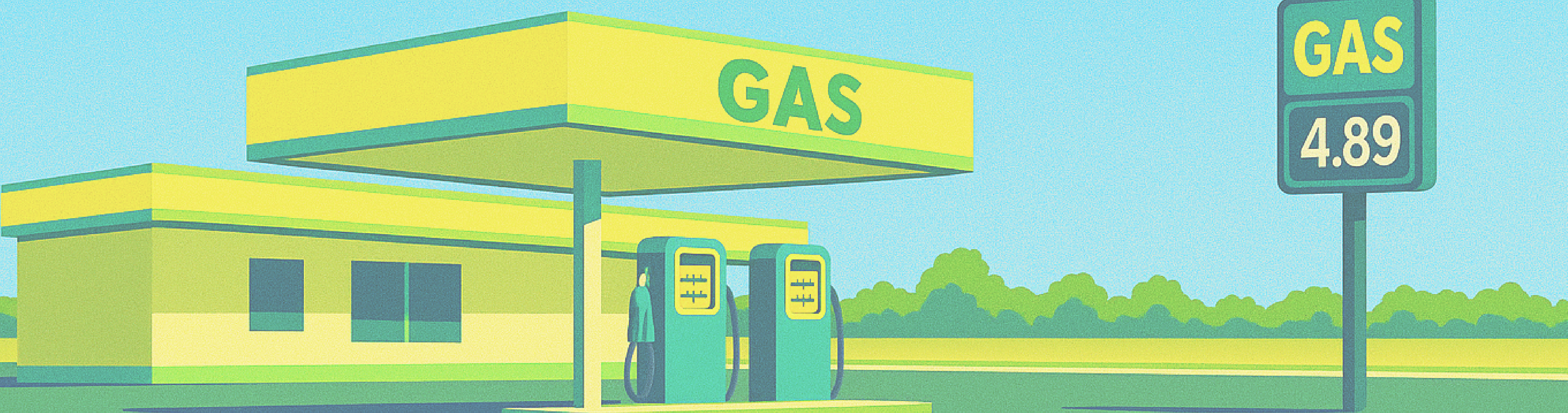

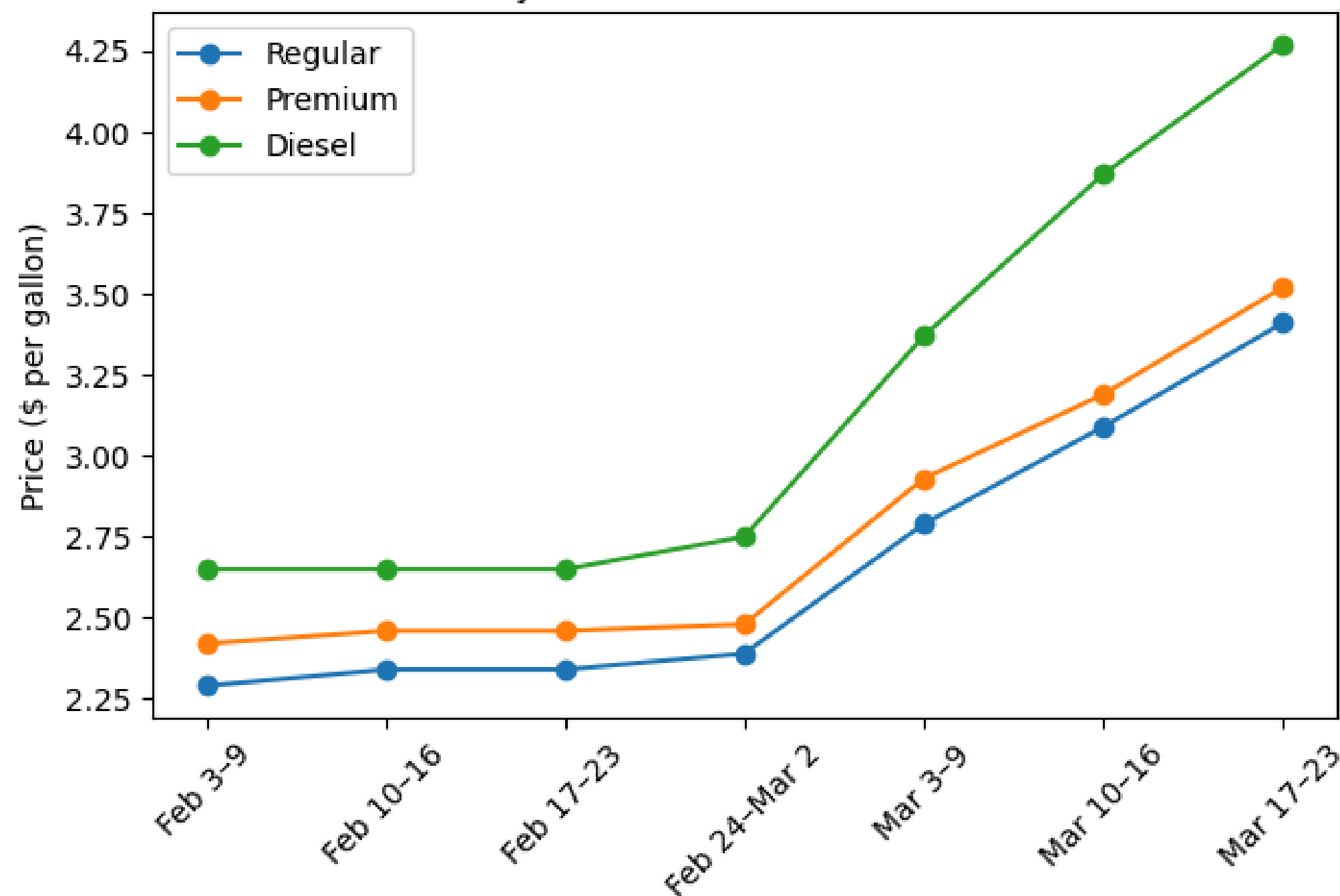

SOL Petroleum Weekly Wholesale Fuel Prices (Feb 3 - Mar 23, 2026)



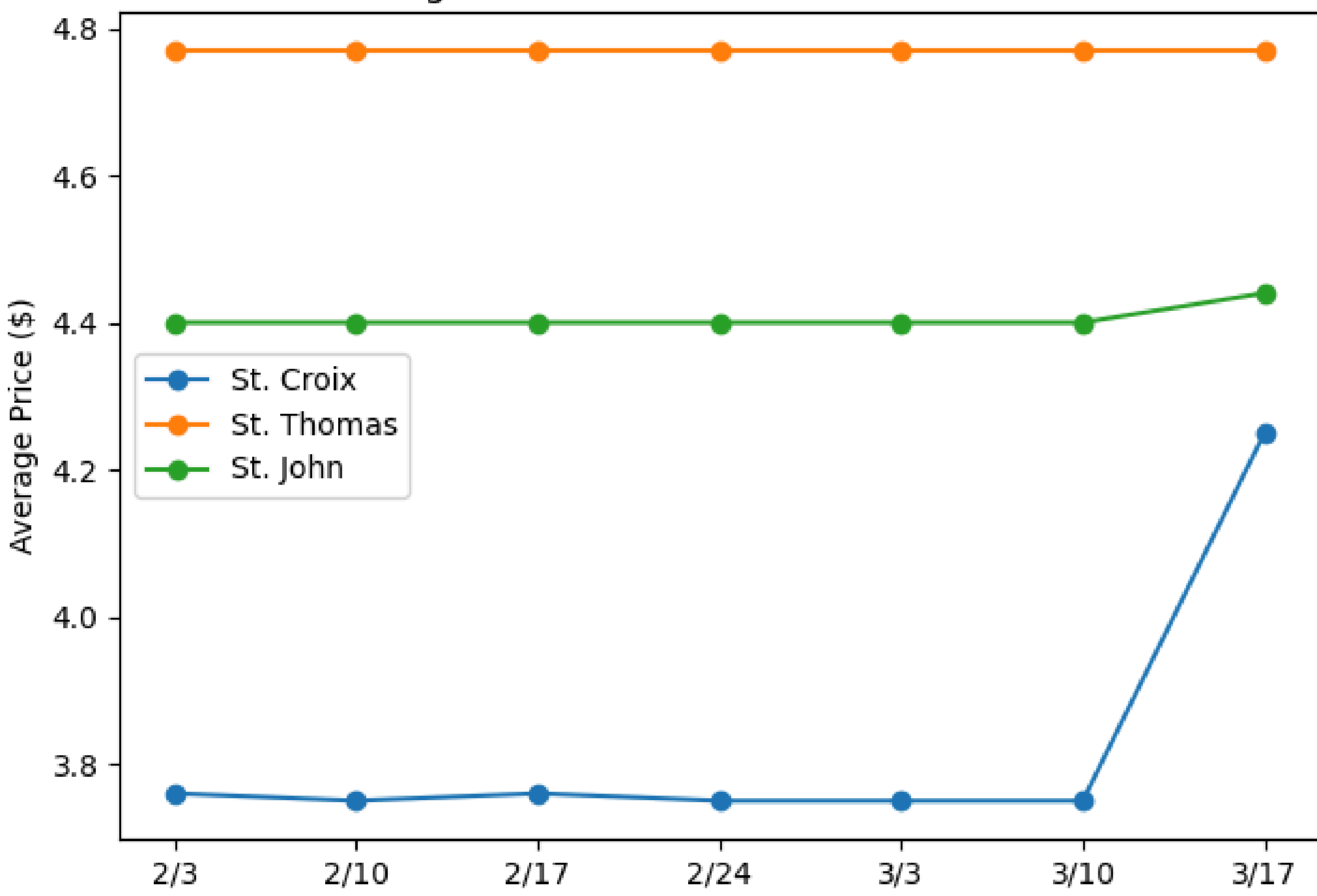
SOL PETROLEUM WHOLESAL FUEL TRENDS (FEBRUARY 3 - MARCH 23)

- All fuel types experienced sharp upward movement, particularly beginning the week of March 3, 2026.
- Diesel recorded the most significant increase:
- Highest dollar increase (+\$1.62)
- Highest percentage increase (+61.1%)
- Regular and premium fuels increased at similar rates, both exceeding +45% growth over the period.
- The market shifted from early stability (Feb) to rapid escalation (March).

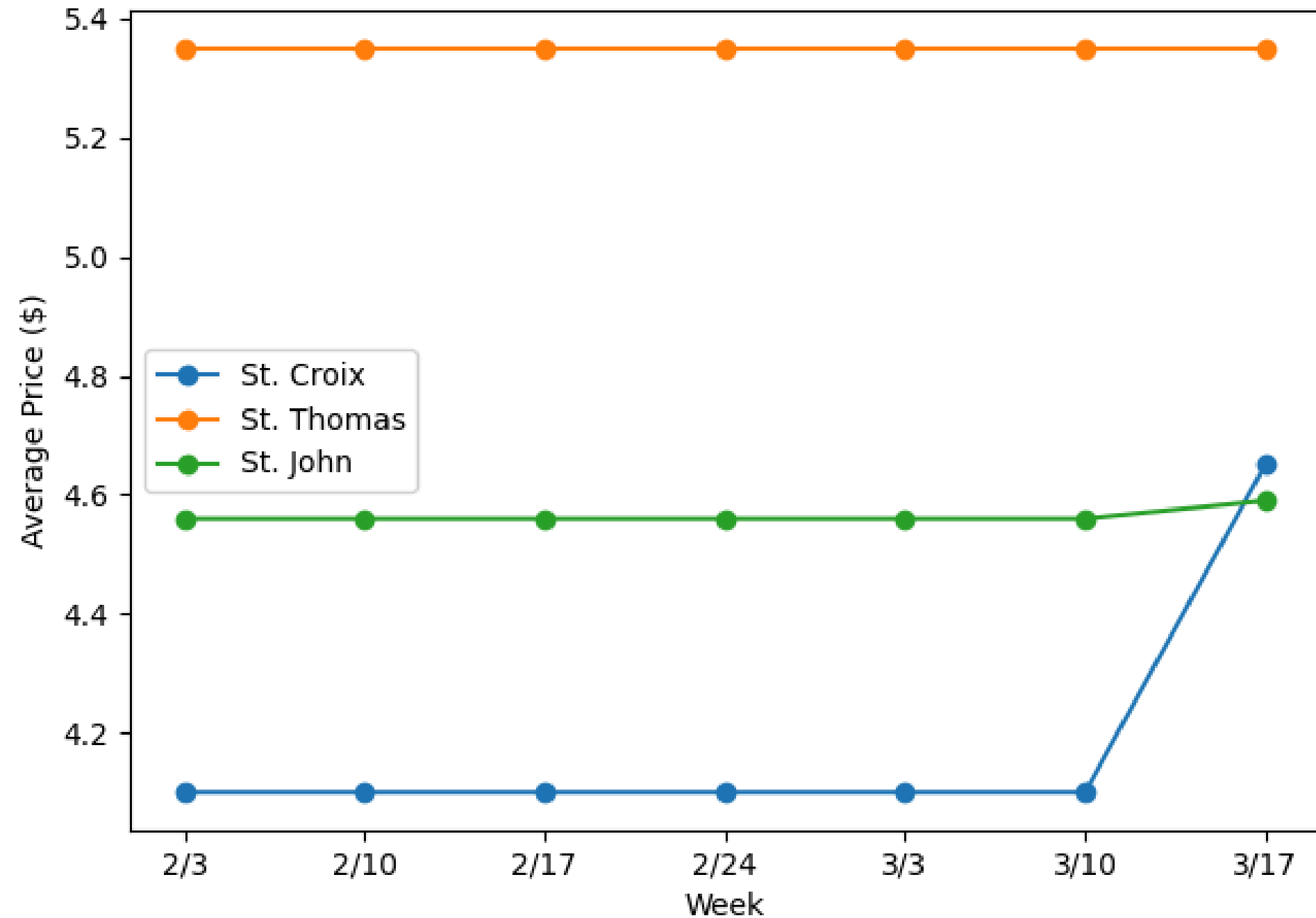
Lowest Prices by Island

- **St. Croix (\$3.639):** GMAX Service Station (lowest in Territory)
- **St. Thomas (\$4.499):** Hometown Convenience Center
- **St. John (\$4.199):** Mid Way Gas

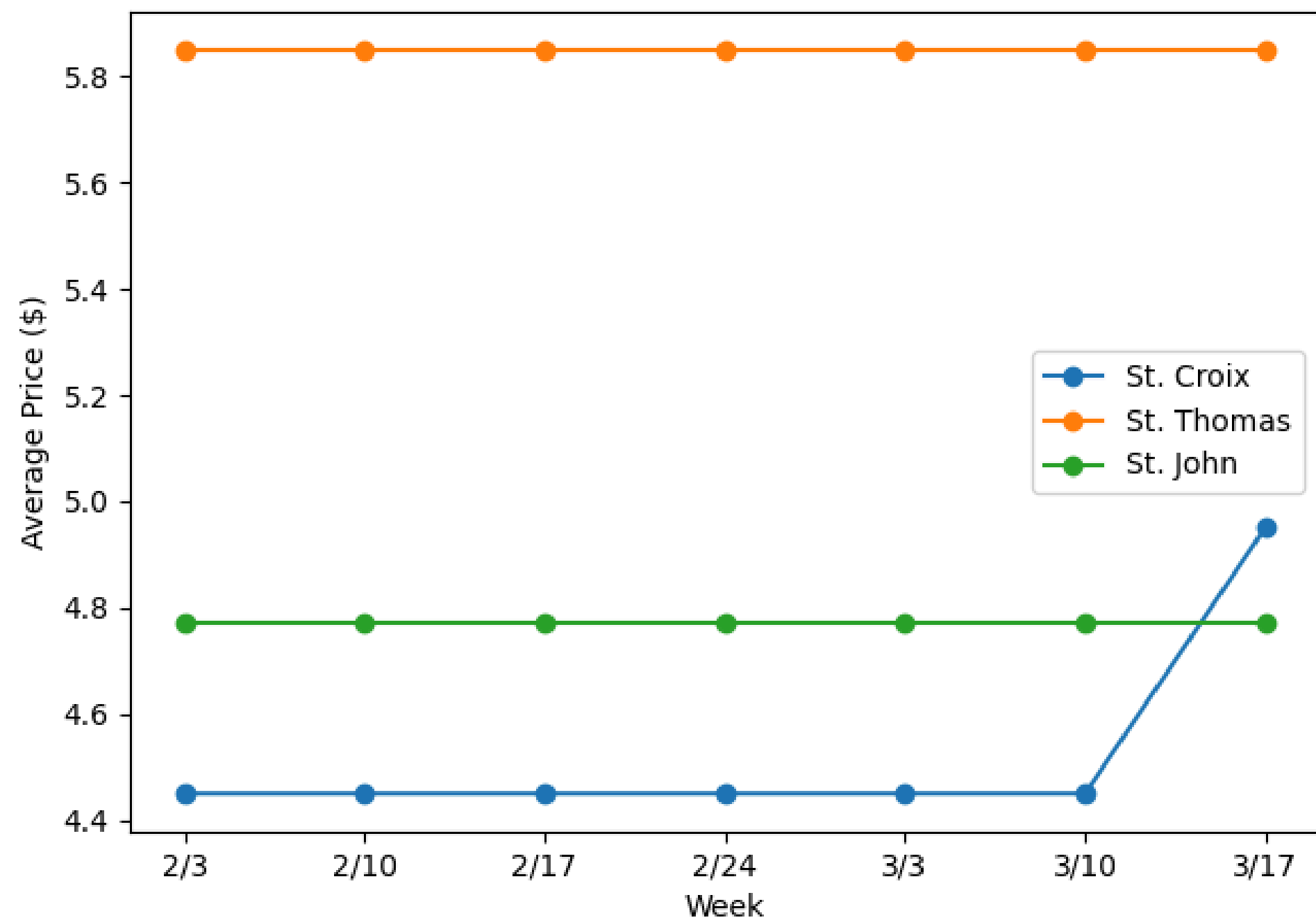
Insights

- St. Croix offers the lowest regular fuel prices Territory-wide, with multiple stations clustered below \$3.70.
- St. Thomas remains the highest-priced market, with limited competition below \$4.50.
- St. John sits mid-range, but still significantly higher than St. Croix.
- The price gap between St. Croix and St. Thomas exceeds \$0.85, reinforcing strong geographic pricing differences.
- Competitive pricing is most active in St. Croix, where multiple stations operate within a tight low-price band.

- **St. Croix (\$3.989):** Five Corner Service Station LLC, GMAX Service Station, Gas For Less Service Station
- **St. Thomas (\$4.999):** Hometown Convenience Center
- **St. John (\$4.399):** E-C Service Station, Mid Way Gas

Insights

- St. Croix offers the lowest premium fuel prices Territory-wide, with three stations tied at \$3.989.
- The price spread between St. Croix and St. Thomas is approximately \$1.01, the widest among gasoline categories.
- St. Thomas pricing remains consistently elevated, with most stations exceeding \$5.19.
- St. John again falls mid-range, with two stations sharing price leadership.
- Premium fuel shows strong clustering behavior, particularly in St. Croix, indicating competitive alignment.

Insights

- St. Croix maintains the lowest diesel pricing Territory-wide.
- The price gap between St. Croix (\$3.999) and St. Thomas (\$5.799) is approximately \$1.80, the largest across all fuel types.
- Diesel demonstrates the greatest inter-island pricing disparity, suggesting structural cost differences.
